Principal

One of the most moving experiences I have had this year has to be my first All Souls' Day here at Wurrumiyanga. We celebrated with a liturgy in the cemetery followed by a special ritual of cleaning family graves. Xavier and MCPS students and staff raked, weeded and beautified headstones and graves. What was so powerful about this was the way that students spoke about their family; they feel so close to them still and know family is looking out for them and guiding them. Non-Tiwis like myself have so much to learn

from this community about our relationships with those who have passed, and our relationship with God.

I would also like to acknowledge the deep loss that family, friends and our schools have felt since the passing of R.Tipungwuti. I hope that our faith helps us believe that, in the words of Henry Scott-Holland:



Death is nothing at all. It does not count. I have only slipped away into the next room. Nothing has happened. Everything remains exactly as it was. I am I, and you are you. and the old life that we lived so fondly together is untouched, unchanged. Whatever we were to each other, that we are still. Life means all that it ever meant.

It is the same as it ever was. There is absolute and unbroken continuity. What is this death but a negligible accident?

Why should I be out of mind because I am out of sight? I am but waiting for you, for an interval, somewhere very near, just round the corner.

One great idea (if you don't already do it) is to check every family member for head lice at least once a week. If someone has head lice, go straight to the clinic for a hair treatment and then wash all sheets and pillows to kill any eggs that may be in the bedding.

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
Literacy




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Cathy Freeman Foundation Camp
