This is Charlotte's first year at Xavier as the Canteen Manager, after taking the reins from her mother



We've been discussing how Wurrumiyanga is a multicultural community, where people come from lots of different countries to live here. Some people come from West Arnhem and Wadeye, and from other countries overseas like Italy, the UK, and India!

The students have also been learning about their rights and responsibilities as Tiwi people,



and as Australian citizens. Students have the responsibility to care for country, such as by cleaning up and burning off country in the dry season using yikwani. Students also have the responsibility as Australian citizens to vote for our leaders when they turn eighteen. Maybe the future Member for Arafura is here in our Jarranga class!
