Tiwi Land Council is creating an Indigenous Protected Area on the Tiwi Islands. Great work Yilinga!








Kipwapi Numeracy

Jarrakalarni

During Term 2, Jarrakarlani students have had some exciting opportunities. Danyon from AFLNT has completed AFL umpiring sessions with the group to develop students' umpiring skills and achieve an umpiring certificate.





Gerard from TITEB has also presented Level 2 First Aid training which will give Jarrakarlani students exciting employment possibilities and the knowledge to help anyone in need around the community. The First Aid training is the first step for their Certificate II in Sport and Recreation.

Culture

During Term 2, students have worked within their gender groups, engaging in separate women's and men's business activities.

The female students went out bush on multiple occasions to collect pandanas and to gather plant roots and leaves. They learned how to strip the pandanas leaves and how to prepare the plant roots

to make dye. The young women learned how to boil the pandanas leaves and how to add different bush ingredients to make the natural colours. The dyed pandanas will be used in future culture lessons as the young women participate in various weaving workshops.

The male students also spent some time out bush hunting for the yams specially used in Kurlama ceremonies. They worked to develop their understanding of Kurlama and the importance this ceremony has in their coming to be a Tiwi man. More recently the male students have begun a project to redesign and reconstruct a Marlani within the school

grounds. This is an exciting endeavour as the space will become more functional and provide a more authentic location to have culture lessons beyond the classroom environment.

Our school-based Culture Program has been led by our capable Tiwi Teachers and supported in a valuable way by senior men and women from the Wurrumiyanga Community.
