

these connections, the Year 8 girls are understanding how all living things in nature depend on each other!

It has been great to see the boys working hard in most lessons. Keep up the good work!




This term the boys have been learning about the six main classes of animals on the planet. They've explored how scientists classify animals into groups, such as mammals, fish, birds and insects, based on their features.

So far this year, senior VET students have been working with TITEB to complete their Certificate II in Community Services. This is a great certificate for helping students to get a job after school at organisations like Catholic Care, Shire Council, Territory Families and TITEB.





We have been learning about how to work with people from different cultural backgrounds, or who may not speak the same language, so that they feel safe and supported. Well done senior VET students!



STAGE 1 ESSENTIAL MATHS Ally

We are very happy to have such a large number of students doing Stage 1 Maths this year! They have all had a great start.

This term we are focusing on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division questions. We are using this knowledge to help us with things that will happen in real life. We are also preparing for continuous assessments to make sure everyone is staying on top of their work! Well done to all students so far.

Our Stage 2 Artists have made a great start to the year, being very brave and trying lots of new media and techniques in their first few weeks of the school year.

The first task is to grow their experience and understanding of different 2D media, needing to reflect on their experiments and document their progress. So far this has included a variety of graphite pencils, chalk pastels, compressed charcoal, water soluble oil pastels, monoprints with block ink, unfamiliar watercolour techniques, perspective drawing and inversion of lights and shadow with still life drawings on black paper. They will continue to build up their 2D art skills and then use them to collaboratively illustrate a book towards the end of the term.
